SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

COMPASS Strategic Plan Update

Dr. VanWagoner presented the working document of the COMPASS Strategic Plan. The COMPASS Strategic Plan can be viewed on the TCAPS website.

The plan consists of three phases:

Phase 1:

- Continuous improvement of academic achievement to maximize student success
- Develop and implement structures and systems of support to increase mental and emotional health and social well-being
- Focus on preventing and addressing harassment and bullying to provide a safe and inclusive environment for all
- Identify and implement strategies regarding student behavior to maximize learning
- Provide additional resources and supports for diverse learners so that all students can be successful
- Assess current conditions and identify areas of improvement related to safety and security, using the best practices to enhance a healthy and productive school environment

Phase 2:

- Attract, recruit, and retain a diverse and robust employee workforce to provide a world-class learning environment
- Develop a 3–5-year facilities plan to provide optimal student learning environments
- Implement strategies to attract and retain students, leading to sustainable enrollment

Phase 3:

- Analyze and improve communication systems to establish a culture of collaboration and transparency
- Develop a collaborative plan for the exploration of a Regional Enhancement millage to prioritize safety, security, and other operational needs
- Engage and collaborate with the community to address resources to the district leading to student success

Administration will keep the Board of Education updated as work is being done on the COMPASS Strategic Plan.

District Highlights

Music Program and Fall Sports

Dr. VanWagoner provided an update on upcoming holiday music programs and fall sports highlights. He also shared that Traverse City West Senior High School and Central High School raised money for cancer at their Pink Out Game.

Hour of Code

Dr. VanWagoner shared the success of Hour of Code. Computer Science Education Week surpassed last year's count of 3,500 participants and inspired more than 5,000 Traverse City Area Public Schools (TCAPS) K-12 students to learn about computer science and coding. This event commenced with Super Science Saturday, a community event developed and hosted by Raptor Robotics Team 1711 and supported by Titan Robotics Team 3767 held on Saturday, where families and community members got involved and helped the district exceed their goal of 5,000 participants in 2022.

TCAPS teachers opted in for their classrooms to participate, and the classes with the most student participation were entered to win a pizza party, generously donated by B.C. Pizza. Winners of the classroom pizza party drawings were Cheryl Ridenour's 3rd grade class from Courtade Elementary, Renee Disbrow from East Middle School, and Jim Baran from Central High School. Courtade had the highest percentage of student participation at the Elementary School level and East Middle School had the highest percentage of student participation at the Secondary level. Hour of Code Plaques will be presented to Courtade and East Middle School for the highest participation in the Hour of Code during the 22-23 school year.

Student Support Network

Dr. VanWagoner expressed gratitude to Team One Credit Union for donating \$1,000 to the Student Support Network. Community members looking for ways to give during the holiday season can visit the Student Support Network page of the district website for further information.

c. School Safety Update

Administration provided the Board with a school safety update. At the January Board of Education meeting, the Board will enter into Closed Session to receive a report from Secure Education Consultants (SEC) on their recent assessment of the district's safety and security. After the Board of Education has received its report in Closed Session, SEC will present an update to the community.

Dr. VanWagoner informed the Board, that beginning January 2023, West Senior High School and West Middle School will have a dedicated police officer provided by Grand Traverse County Sheriff's Department and Garfield Township. The officer will act as a community policeman and provide an increase in presence for both buildings.

Further information is to come forward in January regarding the School Resource Officer Grant Program.
