5. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Legislative Update

Dr. VanWagoner gave an update to the Board of Education on the recently released School Aid Budget. For the first time, there is a transportation categorical within the budget with 300 million dollars being deposited into the fund. Also new to the budget this year is that the safety and security fund now includes mental health.

Administration will continue to work to increase the mental health capacity of the district. Dr. VanWagoner explained a current challenge being faced by the district is the recruitment and retention of school social workers. TCAPS administration is working diligently to brainstorm new ideas to recruit and retain staff for these positions.

b. School Safety Update

Dr. VanWagoner plans to discuss the approval status of the School Resource Officer (SRO) with the Interim City Manager. This approval is time sensitive as TCAPS has to notify the State of Michigan by August 1, 2023, of an officer being hired. The hiring of an SRO is a potential agenda item for the July 17, 2023, City Commission meeting.

Construction on the new safety and security front entrance at Traverse Heights continues to move forward with good progress.

Other school safety updates included administration holding safety and security drills for the central office in the near future.

c. District School Bus Purchase

The Board discussed and reviewed the recommendation from administration to purchase five (5) 77-Passenger Conventional school buses from Hoekstra.

d. Board Policy 5136: Cell Phones and Electronic Communication Devices

Administration provided the Board with current cell phone practices for secondary schools within the district. Associate Superintendent, Kristin Perkowski, presented research on the impact of using phone/social media within the classroom. Board Trustees were also presented with a review that compared other district cell phone restrictions/bans in middle and high schools.

Further discussion continued on Board Policy 5136 - Cell Phones and Electronic Communication Devices amongst Board Trustees. Secondary principals Esper, Stuedemann, and Tiesworth were also at the table for the discussion. Proposed revisions to current Board Policy 5136 were reviewed and discussed in detail.

Motion to amend policy 5136 - Cell Phones and Electronic Communication Devices to read as follows:

The intent of this policy is to enrich the learning environment by reducing external distractions, enhancing student focus, and fostering social interaction.

Subject to the exceptions noted below, during the Educational Period, students may not possess or use cellular telephones and/or other electronic communication or gaming devices (including, but not limited to, net books) on school property (including, but not limited to, school buses), or when off school property for a school sanctioned event and/or field trip.

For purposes of this policy, the "Educational Period" is defined as the time period from the opening morning bell, to the closing afternoon bell on regularly scheduled school days while school is in session.

The limitations of this policy do not apply to the following exceptions:

- When approved and/or directed by instructional staff for educational purposes, or
- When special health related exceptions are granted by Administration

This policy is not intended to restrict the possession of such devices in student lockers for use outside of the Educational Period, or the use of watches or other electronic devices that are not used for cellular communication and/or gaming.

Violations of this policy will result in the immediate confiscation of the device, which will be returned after the closing afternoon bell.

The student who brings electronic devices onto school property shall assume full responsibility for its/their care. At no time shall the District be responsible for preventing theft, loss or damage to cellular telephones and/or other electronic devices brought onto school property.
