4. **RECOGNITION**

Grand Traverse Bay YMCA

Grand Traverse Bay YMCA was recognized for its partnership with TCAPS. TCAPS partners with the YMCA's Safety Around Water Program for all district 3rd graders, which was temporarily suspended during the pandemic. This program provides in-pool water safety and confidence training at no cost to families. Members of the community, TCAPS, and the YMCA have generously funded this program. TCAPS strongly believes it is important to have necessary water safety skills taught at an early age. Michigan, especially Traverse City, has great involvement in water activities. TCAPS students need to be prepared mentally, as well as physically, for the prevention of all types of water emergencies. Building confidence in and around the water is critical to the safety of students.

The West Y was also recognized for its after-school program. The after-school program at West Y has 50-60 middle school students attending daily. Two healthy snack options are provided, along with areas for games, homework, and physical activities. This program is offered Monday-Friday from 2:45 PM - 6:00 PM.

6. <u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT</u>

a. Legislative Update

Dr. VanWagoner provided a legislative update to trustees. This update included information on legislative changes being worked on in education. Currently being debated is the teacher evaluation tool and a retirement bill that would allow a retiree to return to work after 30 days with stipulations.

b. District Highlights

International Day of Peace

International Day of Peace was highlighted in the district with the installation of new peace poles at five schools around the district. Peace poles were funded through a generous donation from Veterans for Peace Chapter 50. On September 21, representatives from Veterans for Peace Chapter 50 unveiled the new poles and attended a school ceremony at TCAPS Montessori for a special unveiling. Additional installations were unveiled at Cherry Knoll, Courtade, Long Lake, and Westwoods Elementary schools.

Gun Safety

TCAPS Board of Education adopted a resolution in November of 2022 known as the BE SMART Gun Safety Resolution. This resolution focuses on the importance of gun safety and firearm storage. The resolution states that the Superintendent and Board of Education will continue to work with local law enforcement agencies, medical and mental health agencies, and non-profit organizations to collaborate and increase efforts on promoting the importance of secure firearm storage and gun violence prevention safety measures. The district will also make informational materials available to parents on an annual basis to coincide with Michigan's hunting season.

Superintendent/Board of Education Student Advisory Council

The first meeting of the Student Advisory Council was held on Tuesday, October 3. There were 54 students in attendance. Discussion centered around the strategic plan initiatives, mental health, and the cell phone policy. There was also a consensus from the group for the naming of the Innovation and Manufacturing Centers.

Lunch Buddies Mentorship Program

The Lunch Buddies Mentorship Program is being expanded for the 2023/24 academic year. Following the resounding success of its pilot run at Traverse Heights and Central Grade last year, TCAPS' Health & Wellbeing Team is excited to expand this innovative mentorship initiative to all district elementary schools. TCAPS invites individuals who are passionate about contributing to the growth and success of TCAPS students to join Lunch Buddies as mentors. Mentors commit to at least one season where they will eat for one (20-minute) lunch and play for two (20-minute) recesses. Most schools have two Lunch Buddies shifts that are approximately one hour long. Consistency is crucial for success, so mentors are encouraged to commit to at least one season, attending most sessions. To become a mentor, community members will need to complete the Lunch Buddies application form, pass a background check, and attend a 30-minute training session conducted by TCAPS staff. More information about the program can be found on the district website.

Patriot Game

The 12th Annual Traverse City Patriot Game is scheduled for Friday, October 20 at 7:00 PM. Student Senators from both high schools are planning to carry on the long-standing tradition of honoring Veterans, active-duty military, and first responders through the TC Patriot Game. Proceeds from the event will go to Veterans for Peace, American Legion Bowen-Holliday Post #35, and VFW Cherryland Post #2780. All Veterans, active duty and first responders get into the game free and can enter Thirlby Field at the 13th Street rolling gate or through the 14th Street main entry. Gates open at 5:30 PM. TCAPS highly encourages buying tickets in advance through Go Fan, however, tickets can also be purchased at the game with cash or credit.

Count Day

TCAPS Count Day is complete. The preliminary number being reported is 8,679 (does not include GSRP, tuition-based preschool, or shared time). This is a slight decrease from last year. Dr. VanWagoner informed trustees that this number is close to what was budgeted.
