

TRAVERSE CITY AREA PUBLIC SCHOOLS BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION

Traverse City Area Public Schools, Grand Traverse, Leelanau and Benzie Counties, Michigan (the "District").

A regular meeting of the Board of Education of the District was held in the Tompkins Boardman Administration Center on the 14 day of November, 2022 at 6 o'clock p.m.

The meeting was called to order at (p) p.m. by President Newman-Bale.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member Mon and supported by Member Mon and supported by Member

- **WHEREAS**, The safety and well-being of our students, teachers, and staff is a top priority in Traverse City Area Public Schools;
- WHEREAS, In Michigan, gun violence is the second leading cause of death in children and teens.
- WHEREAS, Rates of death from firearms among ages 14 to 17 are now 22.5% higher than motor vehicle-related death rates. In the U.S., middle and high school age children are nowmore likely to die as the result of a firearm injury than from any other single cause of death.
- WHEREAS, According to a report from the US Secret Service, in incidents of gun violence on school grounds, 76% of attackers acquired a firearm from the home of a parent or another close relative.²
- WHEREAS, Every year, roughly 350 children under the age of 18 unintentionally shoot themselves or someone else.
- WHEREAS, Nearly 22,000 Americans die by firearm suicide every year including over 950 children and teens.
- WHEREAS, Research indicates that 47% of firearm owners who have children living in their homes do not safely store at least one of their weapons.⁵
- WHEREAS, Evidence strongly suggests that secure firearm storage is an essential component to any effective strategy to keep our community safe;
- WHEREAS, Keeping students, teachers and staff safe from the threat of gun violence should be the responsibility of all adult stakeholders within our school district;



WHEREAS, In order to continue with preventative measures to increase student and school safety we must act now;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board directs the Superintendent to make materials available to parents on an annual basis stressing the importance of secure storage of firearms and by including this annual communication in a districtwide communication distributed to the parents of all school district students;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board directs the Superintendent to at least annually communicate to parents the importance of safe firearm storage and other firearm safety and violence prevention measures to the district during November and at other appropriate times throughout the year;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board and Superintendent will continue to work with local law enforcement agencies, medical and mental health agencies and non-profit organizations to collaborate and increase efforts to inform district parents regarding secure storage of firearms in their homes, as well as other gun violence prevention safety measures.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution shall not be construed to conflict with any existing Michigan or federal law.
