March 16-20 (School offerings by grade level at TCAPS 24/7) March 23-26 (School offerings by grade level at TCAPS 24/7) *enrichment activities offered by TCAPS through TCAPS 24/7

March 27-April 5 (Spring Break) Governor suspends instruction for remainder of year on Thursday April 2nd during TCAPS Spring Break

April 2 - Principals and district leaders begin process of writing <u>Traverse City Area Public Schools</u> <u>Continuity of Education Plan</u>

April 6-10 District awaits ISD and State approval of Continuity Plan -

- · ISD approved first draft of TCAPS plan
- · District and building leaders discussed new normal
- Teachers enter building according to safe procedures by alphabet, with masks/gloves to pack student curriculum materials for each child in bags. This did not include personal items from lockers, etc. A plan for distribution of these items is being addressed by district and health department. Families will be notified as soon as possible with details of a pick-up plan.

April 13-17 Teacher Professional Development - no formal student lessons this week - Teachers will be reaching out to families to check internet availability

- School Staff will be communicating with families about technology needs
- · Parents should fill out the link to request a laptop <u>waitlist request form</u>
- The TCAPS Continuity of Education Plan is a "No Harm" plan. Focus is on engagement rather than performance.

April 20 - 24 Teachers will begin essential element lessons

April 20th begins the "New Normal" – focus engagement, social-emotional health, connection, support, guidance. We do not want to overwhelm families. Engagement can take place in LOTS of different ways and it will look different in different grades and in different classrooms... it will not look like a full day of school spent looking at the computer.

- · All district staff is working hard to learn platforms and methods of delivery as well as to reach ALL families including those who have been difficult to reach thus far.
- · Families can expect district communication weekly, school communication weekly and teacher communication weekly.
